



#### **VOLUNTEERS NEEDED**



SPRING/ SUMMER/ FALL CLEANUP AND BITTERSWEET & GARLIC MUSTARD MAINTENANCE **TOP** Oriental bittersweet is a threat to native environments by aggressively choking out other woody plants. Can easily climb trees up to 90 feet tall. Pervasive all over the pond grounds, more aggressive removal need.





#### BOTTOM Removals of highly invasive garlic mustard, year 3: (L) First Year Rosettes; (C) Second Year Flower April to May; (R) Jewelweed, a native annual plant with showy orange flowers, where garlic mustard had dominated the year before
